Malachi I

6 "A son honors his father, And a servant his master. If then I am the Father, Where is My honor? And if I am a Master, Where is My reverence? Says the Lord of hosts To you priests who despise My name. Yet you say, 'In what way have we despised Your name?'



Malachi I 8 And when you offer the blind as a sacrifice, Is it not evil? And when you offer the lame and sick, Is it not evil? Offer it then to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he accept you favorably?" Says the Lord of hosts.



Malachi I 14 "But cursed be the deceiver Who has in his flock a male, And takes a vow, But sacrifices to the Lord what is blemished— For I am a great King," Says the Lord of hosts, "And My name is to be feared among the nations.





As a gracious King, the Lord delights to show his people favour. But he is still their King, and they must come to him on his terms, not their own. This means they must bring only the sacrifices that he approves and offer them only in the way he allows. Those who did so could be assured that he accepted them with favour.

As the peace-offerings represented communion with God, the offerer must not seek any selfish gratification on such an occasion, but must, on the spot, and at the time, offer all to his God, and in the presence of his God, satisfied with this full outpouring of his own soul to the God who pours out his fellowship in return.
